New flooring in passageway to changing rooms and in the outside toilets.

The flooring contractor has finally confirmed that he is starting work on Monday 4th July. The new flooring will be of the same type as in the gents changing room. In order to carry out the work the contractor needs to remove the existing surface of the concrete floor using a concrete planer, then apply various layers of screed and waterproofing, before laying the finished surface, this is a multi day process. Obviously he cannot work with people using the passageway, and the various layers need time to dry/cure, so as of next Sunday evening (3rd July), the lock on the outer door will be changed, this means that there will be no access to the showers, locker room, tackle etc for part of that week. As soon as the work is complete and the floor ready to be used, the door lock will be changed back to the normal one. In order for the floor in the outside toilets to be replaced, the two outside toilets will have to be temporarily removed, they will be replaced as soon as possible. I apologise in advance for any inconvenience caused, but we are in the hands of outside contractors.
